Evangelism at work... With the leadership of Pastor Krieger, the Evangelism Committee has been studying *The Invitational Christian* by Dave Daubert. The book of eight short chapters examines some reasons that America's mainline churches are in decline and offers "some solid, simple and practical things that every congregation needs to put into place." In the first five chapters the Committee has discovered that studies show that in this modern world people are

looking for a place where they can find answers to relevant questions in their lives. Today's church can provide answers if the people of God listen for those concerns and respond to them by sharing their experiences and understanding of God and God's work in their own lives. The author writes that a healthy congregation encourages people to "move the sermon from the pastor's lips to the lips of the people." One of the first steps in creating this listening/sharing relationship is an invitation by a member to visit our worship service or to become involved in one of our congregational activities. In Chapter Five Pastor Daubert presents four reasons why many Christians fear inviting others: fear of fanaticism, fear of rejection, fear of harming a good relationship, and fear of appearing stupid or foolish. He provides some suggestions for overcoming those fears and empowering congregational members to act more confidently as invitational Christians. Extra copies of *The Invitational Christian* are available in the Fellowship Hall for anyone who wishes to learn more.

Stephen Ministry Why "Stephen" Ministry?

The Biblical Story of Stephen is found in Acts chapter 6. Stephen was selected as one of the seven to serve the day to day needs of the church, chosen because they Bear one another's, burdens were known "to be full of the Spirit and of wisdom."

Stephen ministers bring the light of Christ to those they serve. They wash feet, kneeling in service and willing to face the messy stuff. Gently examining and washing, they create the environment for healing. In the example of Stephen, these ministers serve at table. At the table is where stories are told, nourishment is provided, and relationships find time and space to develop. And these Stephen types aren't pushy about it, but find helpful ways to tell the stories of our God, and to point to Christ's great love, compassion, and mercy. What you share is confidential; what Stephen Ministers share is hope, companionship, prayer, and gentle, deep listening.

Stephen Ministers are not "cure-givers," that is, they do not fix or solve problems of others. Instead, they are "care-givers," who listen, walk alongside, and point to the "cure-giver," our faithful God.

We are thankful that Stephen Ministry is provided through our congregation. We are here to help. Contact us through the pastor, the church office, or by submitting your name confidentially via the information on the wall near the stairs in the fellowship hall. Fill out the form, seal it in an envelope and give it to the office or hand it to a Stephen Minister.

FOOD PANTRY REPORT

As Christ fed the multitudes, the mission of the Grace Lutheran Church Food Pantry is to feed the hungry.

During the month of May the Food Pantry served 275 families and 651 individuals. This is slightly higher than our client numbers in May 2020 when the pandemic had our society pretty well shut down, but still significantly less than we had been serving in "normal" years. We continue to attribute the lower numbers to the many new and temporary sources of support people in need are receiving from free food distributions organized by the Central Illinois Food Bank, extended or expanded food stamp and unemployment benefits, and stimulus checks.

Through May 31, we had served 1,454 families and 3,738 individuals this year. Nearly 40 percent of our clients are children and about one-fourth are over age 55.

Just as happened last year, the onset of summer's heat has brought a surge of homeless clients coming to our outdoor distribution. In addition to providing them bags of food with items that don't require cooking or can openers, we are now stocking bottled water. We also are enhancing the number of personal items and toiletries we give to all clients to include toothpaste, toothbrushes and deodorant.

Blessed by a strong financial position at present, we also continue to provide all clients with milk, bread and eggs, and now that summer is here look forward to adding fresh produce to the mix when possible. Parkes Family Farms continues to be a generous donor of fresh eggs, and Turasky Meats recently donated 300 pounds of venison sticks and sausage rolls that are very popular.

We also continue to help stock a new micro pantry at neighboring First Presbyterian Church, and that church continues to provide us with a \$1,000 donation each month while their Good Samaritan Ministries and its pantry are closed.

In May, the Pantry account had income of \$6,451 and expenses of \$6,393, leaving us with a May 31 account balance of \$87,023. The generosity of the members of our "anchor" churches – Grace, St. John's, Peace and Our Savior's – with their donations of money, food and volunteer hours continues to give us opportunities to look for ways to enhance our services, such as we have done for the homeless and by providing more fresh foods and dairy to everyone.

Thanks to the leadership of Jim Hobbs, the **Pantry's first golf outing** fundraiser is taking shape with both sponsors and golfers beginning to sign up to support this venture. **The event will be held the afternoon of Sunday, August 29 at Piper Glen Golf Club.** Please let Jim know if you might be interested in helping us manage the event that day or have potential sponsors you could contact.
